- 1. Due to GFL Environmental Services' decision to terminate its residential recycling program, agree to delete recycling services from the City of Temple's current agreement with GFL after collections have been completed on Thursday, August 25.
- 2. Approve a new City of Temple schedule for tap fees and remove recycling from the schedule of garbage fees.
- 3. Authorize the City Finance Director to reimburse the sum of \$3,250.00 to four different individuals who recently were charged by the City of Temple the plan review fee for a residential subdivision (\$3,500.00) instead of the fee for a plan review of one single-family residence (\$250.00).
- 4. Authorize the Mayor to sign the proposed agreement with Turnipseed Engineers for design engineering services pertaining to the upgrade of approximately 9,100 linear feet of water lines located adjacent to East Johnson Street and Sage Street, with the scope to include assistance with the bid process and with construction contract administration and with the cost of these services to be equal to 7.5 percent of the bid construction cost.
- 5. Approve City Hall Expansion Change Order #10 in the amount of \$6,585.83, with payment to be made with funds from the 2021 SPLOST.
- 6. Approve the City Hall landscape excavation proposal from Chip's Lawn Care in the amount of \$7,670.00, with funding from the 2021 SPLOST.
